



Graduate Registration Information

Admission

The university offers graduate programs in business, clinical psychology, education, and religion. Prior to registering for classes, all graduate students must be approved for admission as Regular or Provisional standing students.

Advisement

All graduate students must meet with their program for advising on course placement.

Academic Registration Process

Online registration will be available to all current graduate students. Instructions for online registration will be given to students upon meeting with a program advisor. Online registration will be held between April 20-24 for Graduate Psychology students and April 20-August 28 for the other Graduate Programs.

Change of Courses

Changes may not be made after registering without proper filing of a Request to Add or Drop Courses form. All ADD/DROP forms must be signed and approved by the graduate program coordinator. For regularly scheduled courses, dropping a course during the first four weeks may be done without being reflected on the transcript. A regularly scheduled class may be dropped with a grade of "W" within the fourth through eighth weeks of the semester; thereafter, the grade will be recorded as a "WF" when a student withdraws from a course. There is NO AUTOMATIC DROPPING of courses resulting from a student's failure to attend class sessions.

SEMESTER BILLING & REGISTRATION

A Bursar Statement, which contains billing information for the registered semester, is mailed to the student's permanent address on record in June. The Bursar Statement includes charges for the semester based on academic registration. Financial aid information is included when the student's file has been completed sufficiently for the Financial Aid Office to estimate aid. However, actual awards cannot be made to the student's account until their financial aid file is complete. Financial arrangements must be made with the Business Services Office no later than 08/01/2009 (see general fees listed above). Students receiving financial aid for the full amount of their semester costs must make arrangements with the Business Services Office to complete financial registration by 08/01/2009 as well. PAYMENT OPTIONS:

Vanguard University is pleased to present our students and families with three options to pay tuition through our Cashier or online. All payments can be made online at tuitionpay.salliemae.com/vanguard through TuitionPay, a tuition payment service administered by Sallie Mae. Students can access their payment accounts 24 hours a day, 7 days a week through InfoLink with TuitionPay.

Option 1) Pay-In-Full: Pay the full Amount Due on your Bursar Statement for the upcoming semester online through TuitionPay or with the Cashier in Business Services prior to August 1st.

Option 2) Pay 70, Defer 30: Pay 70% of the Amount Due on your Bursar Statement as a down payment, and agree to pay 3 installments of 10% each for the next three months. The down payment must be made online through TuitionPay or with the Cashier in Business Services prior August 1st, and the subsequent installments must be made each month by the 1st. There is no enrollment fee for this option! * If you do not choose an option you will automatically be enrolled in option 2.

Option 3) Tuition Payment Plan: Pay your entire annual tuition in 10 monthly installments rather than in one lump sum. The Tuition Payment Plan will cover the annual amount due (both Fall and Spring semesters) in 9 or 10 installments, interest free with a \$150 enrollment fee. The annual amount due will be calculated by doubling the amount due on your Bursar Statement for the Fall term. **Please note this is an estimate for the year.** To enroll in a plan or pay the enrollment fee, use the TuitionPay website at tuitionpay.salliemae.com/vanguard.

* An additional finance charge of .83% will be charged on any unpaid portion of the student's account on the 25th of each month beginning September 25th. Finance charges will also be assessed on any financial aid not yet applied to the student account. Vanguard's annual TuitionPay Plan is interest free.

REFUND POLICY

The refund schedule of withdrawal from the university or for course load reduction, based on the proper form filed with the Registrar's Office is as follows:

Withdrawal by 09/04/2009	100%	Withdrawal by 10/23/2009	25%
Withdrawal by 09/25/2009	50%	Withdrawal after 10/23/2009	0%

Refund schedule applies to tuition, room, board, student services and unused course fees. Students who withdraw or are expelled from the institution may be required to have some or all of their financial aid returned to the various aid programs. Any student who wishes to withdraw from the University must notify the Registrar's Office of their "intent to withdraw". The amount of financial aid to be returned for the student will be calculated based on this date. Federal aid will be returned based on the amount of the semester the student has completed. State and institutional aid will be returned based on the refund percentage applied to the student's institutional charges. See the Financial Aid Office for calculation.
