Change of Program

Students are responsible for the program selected when registering. Changes may not be made thereafter without proper filing of a Request to Add or Drop Courses form in the Office of the Registrar. For regularly scheduled courses dropping a course during the first four weeks may be done without being reflected on the transcript. Adds **MUST BE APPROVED BY THE INSTRUCTOR AFTER THE FIRST WEEK OF CLASSES**. For regularly scheduled classes a class may be dropped with a grade of "W" within the fourth through eighth weeks of the semester; thereafter the grade will be recorded as an 'F' when a student withdraws from a course. There is **NO AUTOMATIC DROPPING** of courses resulting from a student's failure to attend class sessions.

For those courses that are offered on an unusual calendar the following principle applies: withdrawals received in the Office of the Registrar during regular business hours prior to the end of the first quarter of the total number of class hour sessions offered in the course will have no entry made on the transcript; withdrawals received in the Office of the Registrar during regular business hours prior to the end of the second quarter of total number of class hour sessions will receive a 'W' on the transcript; withdrawals received in the Office of the Registrar during regular business hours prior to the last class hour session will receive a grade of 'F' unless the professor, aware of extenuating circumstances beyond the control of the student, is willing to grant a 'WP' or 'WF.'

Current Student Registration Procedure

Continuing students enrolled in the Fall Semester may initiate registration with their academic advisor. Advisors will supply students with a PIN number so they will be able to register online at access.vanguard.edu. Students will be provided with detailed information regarding online registration by the Office of the Registrar. Students wishing to register in person may do so on Friday, November 14th, and will need to contact the Office of the Registrar for appropriate registration materials.

Registration Times for Continuing Students

Continuing students enrolled in the Fall Semester may register for Spring 2009 online as follows:

Students registering online do so at a designated appointment time supplied to them by the Office of the Registrar or during registration Free Time (7:00 p.m. - 7:00 a.m. 11/10-13 or anytime between 11/14/08-01/16/09). Students registering in person may do so on Friday, November 14th during the hours of 8:30am-4:00pm.

Registration Times for New/Transfer Students

New students will be provided with detailed information regarding online registration by the Admissions Office. Students will receive a PIN number so that they will be able to register online at access.vanguard.edu. Students wishing to register in person or by phone must contact their Admissions Counselor at 800.722.6279. New and transfer students should plan to attend orientation on January 8-11.

FINANCIAL REGISTRATION

Payment arrangements for Spring 2009 may be made during the regular hours of the Business Services Office before Friday, January 9th. Exact terms and conditions can be obtained from the Business Services Office beginning in December. Those not financially registered by January 9th will be dropped from classes. If dropped from classes due to failure to complete financial registration or registering for classes after January 9th a late registration fee of \$100 will be charged. Laboratory, Music and Special Fees are listed in the Course Schedule. The Security Fee is automatically charged to students' accounts. Health Insurance fee is charged to students' accounts with 7 or more units who have accepted the University insurance policy, or have neglected to provide valid health insurance coverage to the Student Life Department during Housing Registration or by January 23, 2009. The University reserves the right to change tuition, fees, and/or charges without advance notice, should conditions so warrant.

Semester Billing & Registration

A Bursar Statement, which contains billing information for the registered semester, is mailed to the student's permanent address of record and/or student box in December. The Bursar Statement includes charges for the semester based on academic and student life registration. Financial aid information is included when the student's file has been completed sufficiently for the Financial Aid Office to estimate aid. However, actual awards cannot be made to the student's account until their financial aid file is complete. Financial arrangements must be made with the Business Services Office no later than 01/09/2009 (see general fees listed above). Students receiving financial aid for the full amount of their semester costs must make arrangements with the Business Services Office to complete financial registration by 01/09/2009 as well. ATTN: Athletes, Student Leaders, Music Students: Financial Registration MUST be completed PRIOR to moving on campus, even if you are required to move in before the Financial Registration deadline. **Students can check their Financial Registration status online by visiting www.vanguard.edu/businessservices.**

Payment Options

1. Payment in full by 01/09/2009, net of grants and scholarships. If Stafford, PLUS, or outside school loans will be used to pay for semester charges, this option may not be used. This option includes payment in full of any prior semester balance.
2. The Standard Option is for at least 70% of the total semester charges to be covered by financial aid or cash payment by 01/09/2009. All prior balances must be paid to be eligible for this option. The remaining 30% is payable in 3 monthly payments due the 15th of February, March, and April. This payment option is subject to a finance charge of .83% per month on the unpaid portion of the student's account including any financial aid and loans not yet posted to the student's account. Business Services Student Master Promissory Note must be signed with the Business Services Office by 01/09/2009 to complete this arrangement with no late fees.
3. Enrollment with Sallie Mae's annual 10-month payment plan. This plan is only available for Fall semester registration. Information will be made available to you by the Business Services Office in June 2009.

Refund Policy

The refund schedule of withdrawal from the university or for course load reduction, based on the proper form filed with the Registrar's Office is as follows:

Withdrawal by 01/23/2009	100%	Withdrawal by 03/06/2009	25%
Withdrawal by 02/06/2009	50%	Withdrawal after 03/06/2009	0%

Refund schedule applies to tuition, room, board, student services and unused course fees. Students who withdraw or are expelled from the institution may be required to have some or all of their financial aid returned to the various aid programs. Any student who wishes to withdraw from the University must notify the Registrar's Office of their "intent to withdraw". The amount of financial aid to be returned for the student will be calculated based on this date. Federal aid will be returned based on the amount of the semester the student has completed. State and institutional aid will be returned based on the refund percentage applied to the student's institutional charges. See the Financial Aid Office for calculation.

Graduate Registration Information

Admission

The university offers graduate programs in business, clinical psychology, education, and religion. Prior to registering for classes, all graduate students must be approved for admission as Regular or Provisional standing students.

Advisement

All graduate students must meet with their program for advising on course placement.

Academic Registration Process

Online registration will be available to all current graduate students. Instructions for online registration will be given to students upon meeting with a program advisor. Online registration will be held between November 17-21 for Graduate Psychology students and November 17-January 16 for the other Graduate Programs.

Change of Courses

Changes may not be made after registering without proper filing of a Request to Add or Drop Courses form. All ADD/DROP forms must be signed and approved by the graduate program coordinator. For regularly scheduled courses, dropping a course during the first four weeks may be done without being reflected on the transcript. A regularly scheduled class may be dropped with a grade of "W" within the fourth through eighth weeks of the semester; thereafter, the grade will be recorded as an "F" when a student withdraws from a course. There is NO AUTOMATIC DROPPING of courses resulting from a student's failure to attend class sessions.

Semester Billing & Registration

A Bursar Statement, which contains billing information for the registered semester, is mailed to the student's permanent address on record in December. The Bursar Statement includes charges for the semester based on academic registration. Financial aid information is included when the student's file has been completed sufficiently for the Financial Aid Office to estimate aid. However, actual awards cannot be made to the student's account until their financial aid file is complete. Financial arrangements must be made with the Business Services Office no later than 01/09/2009 (see general fees listed above). Students receiving financial aid for the full amount of their semester costs must make arrangements with the Business Services Office to complete financial registration by 01/09/2009 as well. For more information regarding your Financial Registration status please visit www.vanguard.edu/businessservices, then click in the Financial Registration link.

Payment Options

1. Payment in full by 01/09/2009, net of grants and scholarships. If Stafford, PLUS, or outside school loans will be used to pay for semester charges, this option may not be used. This option includes payment in full of any prior semester balance.
2. The Standard Option is for at least 70% of the total semester charges to be covered by financial aid or cash payment by 01/09/2009. All prior balances must be paid to be eligible for this option. The remaining 30% is payable in 3 monthly payments due the 15th of February, March, and April. This payment option is subject to a finance charge of .83% per month on the unpaid portion of the student's account including any financial aid and loans not yet posted to the student's account. Business Services Student Master Promissory Note must be signed with the Business Services Office by 01/09/2009 to complete this arrangement with no late fees.
3. Enrollment with Sallie Mae's annual 10-month payment plan. This plan is only available for fall semester registration. Information will be made available to you by the Business Services Office in June 2009.

Refund Policy

The refund schedule of withdrawal from the university or for course load reduction, based on the proper form filed with the Registrar's Office is as follows:

Withdrawal by 01/23/2009	100%	Withdrawal by 03/06/2009	25%
Withdrawal by 02/06/2009	50%	Withdrawal after 03/06/2009	0%

Refund schedule applies to tuition, room, board, student services and unused course fees. Students who withdraw or are expelled from the institution may be required to have some or all of their financial aid returned to the various aid programs. Any student who wishes to withdraw from the University must notify the Registrar's Office of their "intent to withdraw". The amount of financial aid to be returned for the student will be calculated based on this date. Federal aid will be returned based on the amount of the semester the student has completed. State and institutional aid will be returned based on the refund percentage applied to the student's institutional charges. See the Financial Aid Office for calculation.
