APPLICATION FOR ADMISSION

New students who would like to attend a summer school course may apply for admission as a "Student-at Large". Application forms are available through the Admissions Office. Students-at-Large are not eligible for financial aid or on-campus housing. Students are encouraged to apply for admission at least two weeks prior to the summer session they wish to attend.

REGISTRATION PROCEDURE

Early registration for current students occurs during the week Fall 2009 registration occurs. Registration forms are available in the Registrar's Office. Students may also register on the first day of each summer session. Unless otherwise indicated, the last day to enroll for any of the three sessions is the second day of each session, at which time registration must be completed in both the Registrar's and Business Services Offices. Early registration helps to reduce the possibility of a course being cancelled due to inadequate enrollment.

WITHDRAWALS

All withdrawals must be made on official forms in the Registrar's Office. For regularly scheduled courses, withdrawals received by the Registrar's Office by the fourth day of the session will not appear on the transcript; a class may be dropped with a grade of "W" within the fifth through eighth days of the session; thereafter the grade will be recorded as an "WF" when a student withdraws from a course, unless the professor, aware of extenuating circumstances beyond the control of the student, is willing to grant a "WP". There is NO AUTOMATIC DROPPING of courses resulting from a student's failure to attend class sessions. Each student is responsible to complete all financial arrangements.

All charges for summer sessions are due and payable in full by the first day of the session. Failure to register financially by the second day of class will result in the cancellation of your registration by the Business Services Office.

REFUND POLICY

When official withdrawals are filed with the Registrar's Office, refunds will be made in accord with the following: withdrawal the first day, 100% refund; second through fourth day, 50% refund; fifth through eighth day, 25% refund. One day of summer school is equivalent to one week of a full semester.

FINANCIAL AID

Limited financial aid is available to those students carrying a minimum of 6 units. Specific information may be obtained from the Financial Aid Office. Students-at-Large are not eligible for financial aid.
