



Your 2020-2021 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) was selected for a process called verification. The Department of Education requires Vanguard University (VU) to verify your FAFSA information. VU must request any documents that are necessary to confirm the data entered on the FAFSA. If discrepancies are found, we may need to request additional documentation and/or we may make required updates to your application to ensure your FAFSA contains accurate information. It may take up to 30 days for verification to be completed; we will send an email notice to the student's @vanguard.edu email account when verification is complete. All verification documents must be submitted to our office by **August 9** or your need based financial aid will be cancelled.

A. HIGH SCHOOL COMPLETION STATUS

You must submit documentation of high school completion or an equivalent. Check the box of the document you will attach to this worksheet:

- High school diploma or high school transcript including graduation date
- Official documentation from high school counselor stating your graduation date and reason why high school diploma/transcript is unavailable
- General Education Development (GED) Certificate
- State certificate stating you have passed a State-authorized examination recognized as an equivalent of a high school diploma
- Academic transcript of a successfully completed two-year program (60 units) acceptable for transfer for full credit toward a bachelor's degree
- Homeschool student: 1) a transcript or equivalent signed by parent/guardian or program official listing secondary courses you have completed and documentation that you have successfully completed secondary school education; or 2) a secondary school completion credential provided under State law
- If you do not have documentation that meets any of the above requirements and are seeking an associate degree or its equivalent and excelled academically in high school, you may provide documentation from the high school stating that you excelled academically in high school and documentation from your current/future postsecondary institution that you have met their formalized, written policies of admission
